Research Scavenger Hunt: The Call of the Wild

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In order to understand the deeper meaning of this work, it is necessary to explore some of the philosophical ideals that inspired the <u>Naturalist movement</u> in literature. For this group project, you will need to:

- Conduct research using Questia on-line library (1 class period, and continuing at home on internet if need be).
- Keep a record of your sources, as your group must submit a bibliography.
- Present your findings orally to the class with a visual aid.
- This visual aid will be a poster or transparency (for the overhead projector). Information may be in any form you like: flow chart, mind map, etc.

Your work will be given a group grade, so encourage members to do their fair share of the work.
